### Benefits of Medication-Assisted Drug Rehab:

- Lessen or eliminate cravings
- Decrease the severity of withdrawal symptoms
- Create a more focused state of mind
- Improve physical health by removing harmful substances from your life

#### For opioid users:

1. Buprenorphine (known as Suboxone) and Naloxone (known as Zubsolv): prescribed to block the effects of opioids and reduce cravings for opioids; comes in film and tablet form
2. Naltrexone (known as Revia): prescribed to block the effects of opioids; comes in tablet form
3. Naltrexone (known as Vivitrol): prescribed to block the effects of opioids and to reduce craving for opioids; given as a monthly injection

#### For alcohol users:

1. Disulfiram (known as Antabuse): prescribed to deter alcohol use; comes in tablet form
2. Naltrexone (known as Revia): prescribed to reduce craving for alcohol; comes in tablet form
3. Naltrexone (known as Vivitrol): prescribed to reduce craving for alcohol; given as a monthly injection
4. Acamprosate (known as Campral): prescribed to reduce craving for alcohol; comes in tablet form
